The meeting was called to order at 5:18 p.m.

The principal's report included the following items: teacher in-service day on May 12, the lunch provided by the Board on May 12, the Theater at Monmouth's presentation on May 13, Amelia Campbell and Natalie Jones have returned from their study/semester studying off campus, the 7th and 8th grades' week at Camp Kieve, Terry Goodhue's "Warbler Walks," a volunteer appreciation luncheon on May 21, Michael Togus's visit and talk on historical research, *Phantom Toolbooth's* production with 172 people attending over the four days, the *Pilot* is at the printers and will be back next week, Barney's personal days, Appleton School's visit on May 28, the Fox Island Arts Festival May 29, the Island Institute tour, U.S. Secretary of Education Margaret Spellings's visit, the Rowing Teams' competition in the Spring Wave in Vermont, Amelia Campbell's presentation on her semester, Frank Keller's presentation on Vocational Rehabilitation, an early dismissal day yesterday for transition conferences, driver's education will be offered this summer for ten students, the track program has had two students qualify for the State's student attitude and civility award, baccalaureate is this Sunday, the Tour de Sol has been cancelled, graduation is "coming together" for June 13, and Carolyn Taylor is a new grandmother.

The superintendent reported that the town does not want the modular building. We will be aggressively advertising it for sale by bid. He also reported we will be moving three buildings (the buildings that Terry uses and the two 8x12 storage buildings).

The principal described Anthony Rattina's application to be a tuition student here. On the basis of having met with him and having reviewed his application and transcripts he recommends accepting him. The Board reviewed his application.
